PICKING UP & DROPPING OFF CHILDREN AROUND SCHOOLS.

For the safety of children, parents are reminded to take care and obey parking signs when picking up or dropping off children around schools. Council's Parking & Information Officers regularly patrol school areas during start and finish times and motorists detected breaching parking regulations risk being issued with a Penalty Infringement Notice.

Remember, as soon as you stop to let your children in or out of the car, you are deemed to be parked. You do not have to leave your car or turn the engine off to be fined so please ensure you are parked in a legal parking area.

At children's crossings, you must remain stationary at the stop line while any person (including an adult or the supervisor) is on the crossing or the stop sign is displayed. Do not let your child alight at this time, ensure that they wait until you are safely and legally parked.

If you breach a parking regulation the Parking & Information Officer assigned to monitor the crossing will usually record your registration number and details, and the Penalty Infringement Notice will be posted to you within the next three days.

City of Greater Geelong has called the School and confirmed that due to community feedback they will be sending random parking inspectors to the school on a regular basis to ensure safe and legal parking. Please be aware of this when parking near the school.



On Tuesday the 16th of March the 3/4s had an incursion about being a Healthy Hero. Firstly, when we walked into the multipurpose room and we met Amy, who talked us through the session also there was two Cats players called Wylie Buzza and Nakia Cockatoo. Amy started to get us into some activities, firstly we learnt about staying fit guess what??? You at least have to have one hour of fitness each day to keep you happy. After that we talked about healthy eating and the 5 food groups that is good for you. We were asked the 5 food groups there was; protein, vegetables, fruit, grains and dairy.

We learnt about water and how much you can drink each day. They players talked about how much water you can drink each day that is at least seven glasses each day. Did you know that your brain is made up of 75% of water wow that's a fact.

On Tuesday the 26th of March the grade 3/4's participated in an incursion run by two of the Geelong Cats AFL players, Wylie Buzza (number 12) and Nakia Cockatoo (number 5).

Once we had all been seated in the Jeff Walker Hall (also known as the Multi-Purpose Room) Amy introduced us to Nakia and Wylie. Once we were introduced to the two footy players we were allowed to ask them some questions. After 2 students had asked the questions we watched another video from the Healthy Heroes Collection. This was about 2 AFLW players cooking healthy food and telling us what food is good for us, what food is bad for us and the different food categories. This video was thoughtful and VERY inspiring.

After we watched the food video we did some exercises such as side stretches, tuck jumps, star jumps and kicks with an imaginary football.

At the end we did a talk and turn activity. A turn and talk is when you turn to the person next to you and talked about what we had done in this session. After that unfortunately our time had run out. But before we all left Nakia and Wylie signed jumpers, scarves, beanies, sheets of papers etc. I brought a piece of paper along and I got Wylie and Nakia to sign my piece of paper then when I got home I gave the paper with the signatures to my nan.
